Resolution Regarding Use of Rafts

The Building and Use Restrictions governing Lake Geneva Property Owners Association ("LGPOA") provide that in order to control the use of the Lake Geneva, and thereby benefit all residents of the lands around the lake, the waters of Lake Geneva, shall be owned by Lake Geneva, and the lands normally flowed and covered by the lake at its highest border on the waters of the lake shall not include any riparian rights in and to said waters, or to the lands below said waters. The purpose of this Resolution is to ensure a safe lake environment for boaters and swimmers.

- 1. Rafts are defined as floating rafts, swimming rafts, trampolines, floats, and platforms.
- 2. Permanent rafts are prohibited. Rafts may be used on the lake from May 1st through November 1st each year.
- 3. Rafts shall not exceed 100 square feet in surface area.
- 4. Rafts shall not be anchored in the lake so as to impede navigation or present a safety hazard to water craft.
- 5. Rafts shall be anchored so that the side closest to shore is no further than 36 feet from the shore.
- 6. Rafts shall not have ropes, lines, or other barriers between the raft and the shore.
- 7. Rafts shall display lights or yellow or orange reflectors on all sides or at every 90 degrees visible to boats at night.
